The UNAI is a global initiative that aligns all the world’s universities with the UN in the realization of the targets and mandate throughout the activity and researches, creates and intellectual culture of the social responsibility in the academic sphere. Ten UN programs of “Academic Impact” supervise appropriate number of universities throughout the world.

KazNU is one of the leading universities in the world that creates and realizes the ideas on sustainable development. The academic community of al-Farabi KazNU has been a member of the United Nations Academic Impact Initiative for the last 5 years:

1. Al-Farabi KazNU became a member of the UNAI in 2015.
2. Al-Farabi KazNU became a member of the UNAI for 2016-2017 academic years.
3. Al-Farabi KazNU became a member of the UNAI for the 2018-2020 academic years.
4. Al-Farabi KazNU has extended its membership for the UNAI by October, 2021.

January 22, 2020

COMPETENCY IN HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM

Al-Farabi KazNU held a joint meeting of educational associations of the University of Narkhoz and KazNU, which was attended by representatives of the RUMS and the heads of universities of the Republic of Kazakhstan. The subject of discussion was the movement of UMO RUMS from a collegial body to a design office and the competitiveness of universities.

The session “Competitiveness of the higher education system and individual universities” was devoted to strategically important issues of the development of higher education.

The session discussed issues of increasing the competitiveness of universities, ways to enter the WUR and QS WUR international ratings, measures aimed at improving the quality of higher education.

Currently, in order to increase the competitiveness of universities, various state programs are being developed and implemented. Most of the programs to increase the competitiveness of leading universities and their consortia are aimed at improving the level of integration of universities with the real sector of the economy. This will accelerate the transfer of knowledge and technology to the economy in order to ensure long-term economic growth and ensure sustainable socio-economic development of the country.

DIGITAL WISDOM

As the UN Academic Impact Hub on Sustainability, Al-Farabi KazNU has been actively implementing the program «Invitation of Foreign Scientists and Specialists». In this respect, Professor of the Jyväskylä Business School (Finland), Ayzhaz Sheikh visited the University in order to give lectures and conduct joint scientific research.

Professor Aijaz Shaikh is a world-renowned scientist, famous for his research in digital technology in the field of marketing. His research interests include digital technology, mobile applications, and digital marketing. He is the author of more than 30 scientific papers, 24 publications in the Scopus database, including papers with a high impact factor, (h-index: 9). In addition, he is the foreign supervisor of the PhD students at the Faculty of the Higher School of Economics and Business.

In Al-Farabi KazNU, Professor has been working with colleagues on a plan for joint publications, research projects and teaching materials. The main purpose of his visit is to give lectures and conduct seminars on the topic «Writing and publishing articles in journals with a high impact factor» («Scientific Writing», «Academic Writing», and «Scientific Methodology») and consultative lectures on the preparation and sending of scientific papers in high impact factor journals for PhD students.

In the age of globalization, introduction of new technologies contributes to the rapid growth and acceleration of the process of successful development of the state and society. Cooperation in the field of science and education is important for everyone. Universities, jointly exploring and discovering new directions in science and technology, will be able to achieve great results.

The guests showed interest in the Supercomputer and the International IT Technology Park of the University Alliance of the Silk Road, which is being implemented under the University 4.0 model jointly with the UN Alliance of Civilizations.

It should be noted that the IT-Technology Park and the Center for Supercomputer and Cloud Computing, that are created according to the Silicon Valley model, will be located in the High-Tech Zone of KazNU. The parties also expressed mutual interest in implementing joint scientific and innovative projects in the field of IT, Chemistry, Physics, Biology and Nanotechnology.

COOPERATION FOR SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

As the Global Hub on sustainability al-Farabi KazNU held a meeting with a delegation from France led by Mr. Gilles Thibault where both sides discussed the possibility of opening the Kazakh-French Institute of Science and Technology.

During the visit to KazNU, foreign guests got acquainted with the activities of the Kazakh-French Center of «GeoEnergetics», established on the initiative of Presidents N. Nazarbayev and N. Sarkazi in 2010. During this time, many undergraduates and doctoral students of the leading Kazakhstani University were trained at HEIs in France, including under the double-degree program.

The Center is constantly expanding its activities, involving new Universities and French companies in the process of training specialists for Kazakhstan.

Representatives of the inspectorate of the French Foreign Ministry praised the activities of the Center of «GeoEnergetics» and put forward a proposal on its transformation into the Kazakh-French Institute of Science and Technology.

The creation of such a joint Institute will attract investment from French companies operating in Kazakhstan to the implementation of mutually beneficial projects, and it will increase the level of scientific and practical training of students, and will also facilitate the employment of graduates.





February 12, 2020

INTERNATIONAL METHODOLOGICAL CONFERENCE

Within the framework of the United Nations Academic Impact Initiative Al-Farabi KazNU held the 50th International Scientific and Methodological Conference «Modern Interpretation of the Pedagogical Concept of al-Farabi in the Context of Digitalization of Education» in which actual problems of the modern educational process was discussed.

This major international forum included issues relevant to modern higher education such as the creation of popular educational programs based on the development of the competency model of the graduate of Al-Farabi KazNU; the problems of interaction between education, production and business; and the formation of unique attributes and skills of modern graduates that can make them relevant in the labor market and many others.

On the agenda of the International Methodological Conference, a master class entitled «Developing a graduate model in the framework of harmonizing educational programs by training levels» was held at the Higher School of Economics and Business of Al-Farabi KazNU, which was initiated and prepared by the Department of Business Technologies.





February 18, 2020

MODERNIZATION OF ENGINEERING EDUCATION IN CENTRAL ASIA

As the Global Hub of the UNAI on Sustainability, al-Farabi KazNU organized an International Conference «Modernization of Engineering Education in the Central Asian region in the context of digitalization» jointly with the Kazakhstani Association of Engineering Education (KazSEE) and the European Network for Accreditation in the Field of Engineering Education (ENAE).

On the agenda there were workshops on «Review of international accreditation systems. Methods for ensuring the quality of engineering education» which was made by Vice President of ENAE Jose Carlos Quadrado. Of great interest was also the presentation «Problems and Prospects for the Implementation of the Khujand Agreement in Central Asia» by the President of the Central Asian Federation of Engineering Education Communities Dr. D.K. Suleev.

Following the meeting, a decision was made, preserving the ideology of the Khujand agreement, to expand the framework of cooperation in Central Asia and to attract for this purpose various institutions and business structures dealing with accreditation.

THE 1150TH ANNIVERSARY OF AL-FARABI LAUNCHES IN INDIA

The events dedicated to the 1150th anniversary of Al-Farabi has been launched in India. Al-Farabi KazNU, with the support of the Embassy of the Republic of Kazakhstan in India and the Jawaharlal Nehru University held a Round table in New Delhi dedicated to the 1150th anniversary of Abu Nasr Al-Farabi.

It should be highlighted that the anniversary of Al-Farabi is included in the calendar of memorable dates and events of the UNESCO, and its celebration will give a powerful impetus to the study and understanding of the world heritage of the «Second Teacher» of humanity. Today, the name of the thinker of the Great Steppe is of vital interest to scientists of various countries, including India. During the Round table, the delegation of KazNU made scientific reports and presentations about the life and work of Al-Farabi, the significance of its heritage in modern times. A model of the University of the new generation «University 4.0» was also presented, which was developed on the basis of the ideas of the thinker, including spiritual, moral, and scientific and technological platforms.

Speakers from academia, heads of scientific centers and institutes in India also highlighted the significance of Abu Nasr al-Farabi's legacy and stressed the importance of such events for bringing together the cultures of two friendly countries.





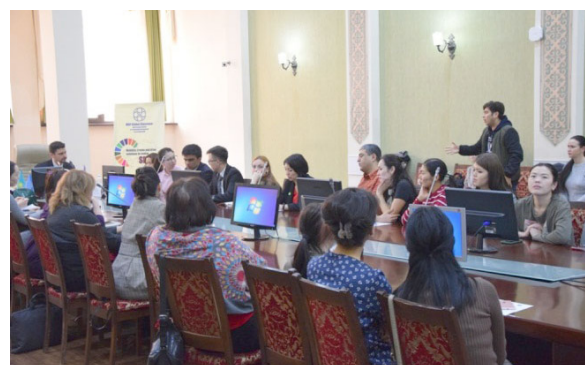
February 21, 2020

INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS IN GLOBAL HEALTH

ONLY GIRLS IN UNISAT

Within the framework of the United Nations Academic Impact Initiative Al-Farabi KazNU, together with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has launched an educational project for girls on the development of UniSat nanosatellites.

In fact, 20 girls were selected to participate in the project. These are students of Kazakhstani Universities and high school students. They will have a unique opportunity to study courses on creating a nanosatellite based on the Scientific and Technological Park of Al-Farabi KazNU. The training will last five months and include such important stages of creating any spacecraft as projecting, design, programming, assembly, testing and launch. By the time the training is complete, girls should create models of nanosatellites and launch them into the upper atmosphere.

The project is interesting for its gender focus. Destroying the usual stereotype, it proves that the sphere of nanotechnology, programming and design of spacecraft is subject to the fair half of humanity.

GLOBAL HEALTH: SCIENCE RING ON EUTHANASIA



Students of the Faculty of Medicine and Healthcare at al-Farabi KazNU demonstrated brilliant erudition and great scientific potential on the intellectual game «Science Ring», organized by the teaching staff of the Department.

In the modern world, the problem of euthanasia is one of the most discussed in society. It is located at the intersection of a huge range of disciplines - medicine, law, psychology of philosophy, and religion. For a full discussion of it, the participation of specialists from all these areas is necessary. Therefore, our undergraduates did not remain aloof from the fully discussed issue, to which it is difficult to find a single point of view and a humane comprehensive answer. Modern youth in medicine has erudition and great scientific potential. This was vividly demonstrated by undergraduates in the intellectual game «Science Ring». The competition was attended by two teams such as called «Researchers» and «Life Formula».

At the beginning of the event, the organizers announced the rules according to which the game took place in 2 rounds, the teams were given 1 minute to think about the answer, the countdown began after the host's command: «Time», and in the event of a false start for one of the teams, the right of reply passed to the opposing team. In case of an incorrect answer, the right to answer was transferred to the opposing team with the addition of 20 seconds.

According to the results of a rather intense game, the team «Life Formula» was recognized as the winner. In the process of intellectual battle, the participants were able to demonstrate worthy knowledge not only in the field of medicine, but rather emotionally presented the arguments for and against the legal, economic,

religious, and social euthanasia. In general, Science Ring was dynamic, exciting, and bright, which aroused the interest of young scientists.

«MEN ZHASTARGA SENEMIN» REPUBLICAN STUDENT COMPETITION LAUNCHES

A republican competition organized at al-Farabi KazNU has been a significant platform throughout the country for eight years. The competition is aimed at the development of patriotism, civic responsibility, intellectual and creative potential of youth.



Traditionally, the competition program includes nominations for the best student innovative project and start-up on the topic «My real contribution to the innovative development of the country», and the social project «Qayiryndy Qogam», as well as the best essay contest «What can I do for the prosperity of the Homeland», and poetic work and song contest on a patriotic theme.

The first qualifying round will be held remotely from 10 to 30 April this year. After online registration, participants should send video and their work in electronic form to the organizing committee. Participation in the competition is a great opportunity for students to prove themselves, share their socially significant initiatives and creative projects. Based on the results of the remote qualifying round, the participants who qualified for the final will be determined. The videos and creative works of the finalists are planned to be posted on social networks, where anyone can vote for their favorite work.

The final of the competition will be held as part of the VIII forum «Men Zhastarga Senemin!» in November 2020 at Al-Farabi KazNU. Participants will have the opportunity to present and defend their projects at meetings of thematic sections. An independent jury will provide an objective assessment of the work of the contest participants. It will include authoritative experts – public figures, representatives of science, culture and art, business, government agencies and the media. The competent jury will determine the best works at each stage - from the remote qualifying round to the final competition in Almaty.

The main prize refers to Al-Farabi KazNU's grant for a year of tuition free education. According to the results of online voting, a prize of audience sympathy will also be awarded.

DISTANT LEARNING ALL THE WAY



The UNAI Global Hub of al-Farabi KazNU is one of the first among universities of Kazakhstan completely switched to remote form of studying due to the COVID-19 Pandemic lockdown. Lectures, seminars and practice sessions at hundreds of thousands of university students are held online. For the purpose of acquaintance and check of the organization of distance learning in the conditions of a quarantine the university was visited the project manager «Sanaly urpaq» by Kayyrzhan Tokushev and the head of prevention and respectability of Department of the agency on anti-corruption on Almaty Elnar Igilikov.

Since March 16, 2020, KazNU has implemented remote educational technologies (DOT) in two information and educational systems - «Univer» (univer.kaznu.kz) and remote education «MOODLE» (dl.kaznu.kz). In the course of training, auxiliary digital services «ZOOM,» Microsoft Teams, «DL,» etc., are also used.

As the Vice-Rector of KazNU for Educational Work Askar Hikmetov claimed that the developed IT-infrastructure of the university allows today to cover remote education of all students of 16 faculties. The distance learning process is overseen by three university structures. Thus, in the «Univer» system it is possible to track the activity of the educational process. The staff of the CSO monitor the schedule of each teacher and can check the classes in real time.

Today, mass events and meetings have been suspended on campus and in the KazNU students houses due to the state of emergency in the country. In all buildings and student dormitories there are information sheets and stands for the prevention of COVID-19 and dispensers with disinfectant are installed.

THE «FARABI WORLD» CONFERENCE



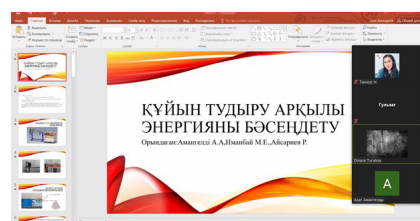
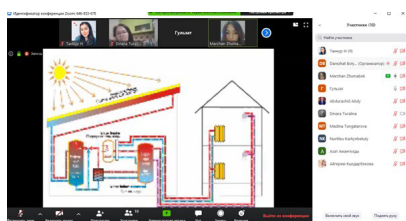
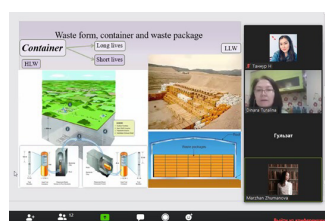
The annual International Conference of students and young scientists «The Farabi's World» and the contest «Best Young Scientist» were held online this year. In connection with activities aimed at the non-proliferation of coronavirus infection COVID-19, Al-Farabi KazNU carries out activities in a remote format with the use of modern information

and communication technologies. From April 6 to 9, 2020, the traditional annual International Scientific Conference of students and young scientists «The Farabi's World» in online format was held at the University. The Conference was organized at a high level. Undergraduate and graduate students, and PhD candidates and young scientists of Universities and Institutes, Scientific Centers of the Republic and near and far abroad countries took an active part in the work of various sessions of the Conference.

As a whole, 3094 reports of participants were heard, 383 from other higher education institutions of RK, 117 from the countries of near and far abroad. 122 sections, 70 round tables and scientific seminars were held within the framework of the Conference at the Faculties of KazNU. Following the results of Conference, Rector of University, Galym Mutanov, awarded 48 students with Diplomas and money prizes.

In addition, the traditional contest entitled «Best Young Scientist of Al-Farabi KazNU» was held as part of the Conference that is aimed at organizational and methodical support of young scientists of the University, who are actively engaged in scientific and innovative activities, popularization of their scientific achievements, introduction of the results of research into educational and production processes.

The main criteria for determining the winners of the competition were indicators of publication activity, including in international ranking publications, the availability of legal documents (patents, copyright certificates), participation or management of the scientific project, etc.

COMPETITION «BEST YOUNG SCIENTIST»

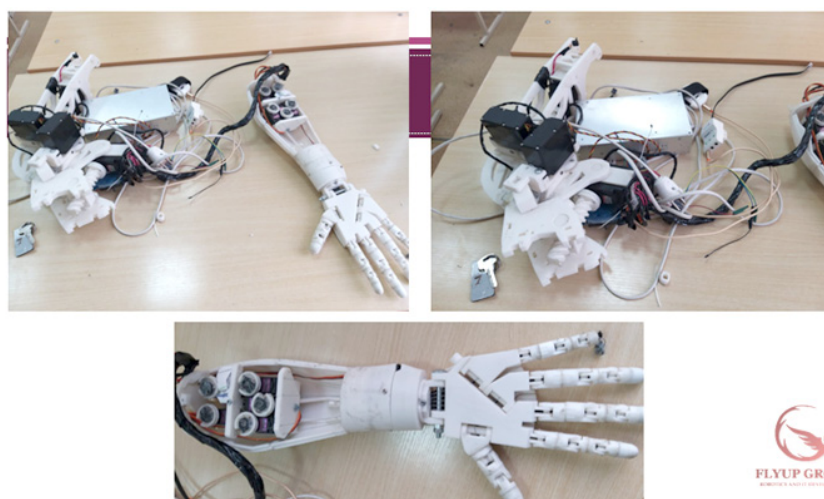

HIGH RECOGNITION BY THE UN



By decision of the United Nations, Al-Farabi KazNU will continue to lead the Global Hub of the UN Academic Impact Program on Sustainable Development for the fourth consecutive term. This is evidence of the high international recognition of successful activities of the leading Kazakhstani University, which is making a significant contribution to

realization of the goals of sustainable development.

The Academic Impact Program on Sustainable Development was initiated by Eighth Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon. After leading the Global Hub in 2014, KazNU became the first and only University in the CIS to be awarded such a high position at the international level. Having become one of the 10 world Hubs of the United Nations, KazNU coordinates and actively involves the world academic community in the realization of the 17 goals on sustainable development of mankind, aimed at preserving the resources of the planet, ensuring the availability of quality education and well-being, developing innovations, and preserving ecosystems, etc.

Heading the Global Hub, KazNU has developed and introduced a model of a new generation of higher education institution – «University 4.0». It is based on a symbiosis of technological and spiritual-moral platforms and is aimed at the formation of responsible citizens of the world. Together with the Alliance of Civilizations, the Model was presented at the UN headquarters in New York and recommended as promising and relevant for wide distribution among Universities around the world.

The UNESCO Chairs on Sustainable Development, as well as International Journalism and Media in Society, have been successfully operating at the University. In addition, the «MDP Global Classroom» training programme on sustainable development is being successfully implemented with Columbia University (USA). The University is also part of the world student project «UN Model – New Silk Road».

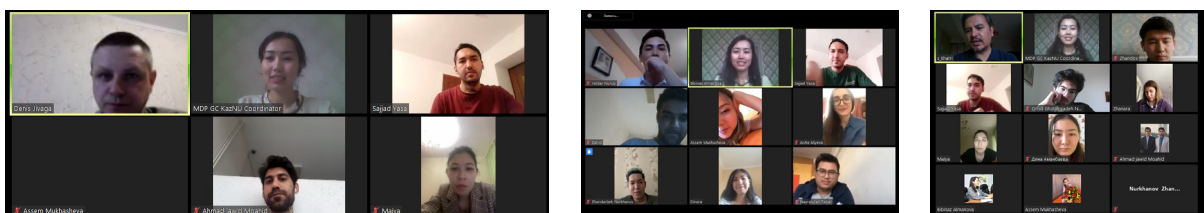

The event, dedicated to the 75th anniversary of the UN and the end of the World War II, was organized by Al-Farabi KazNU on the UN Academic Impact Initiative with the support of the United Nations Information Bureau and the Representative Office of the MFA of the RK in Almaty. 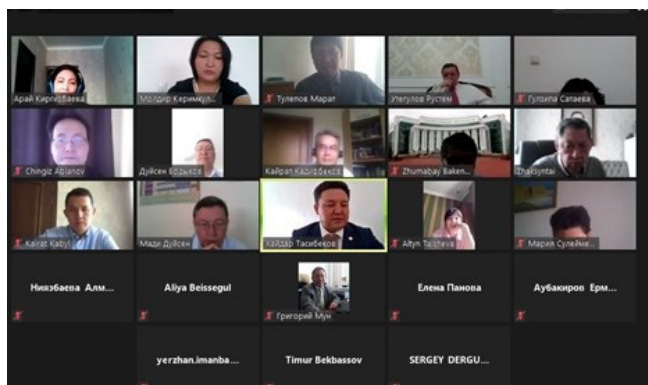
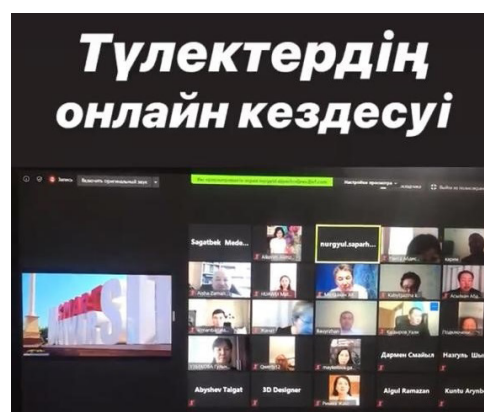
MAY 30 – KAZNU’S ALUMNI DAY!

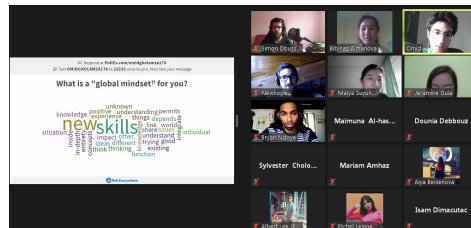
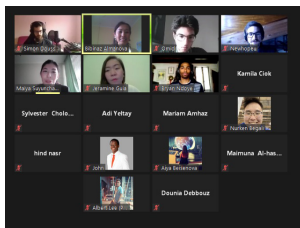

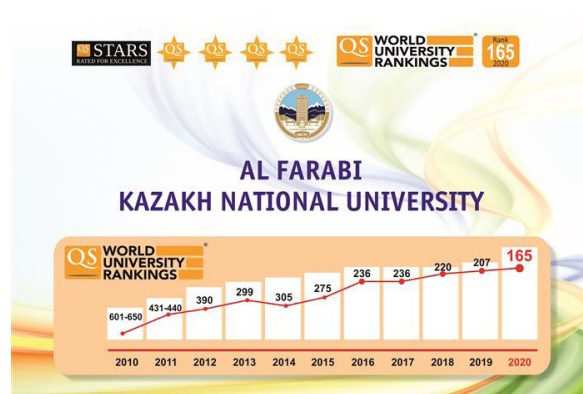

This event hosts 15 keynote speakers in its network sessions from global thought leaders to inspirational business trainers.



June 10, 2020

KAZNU ENTERED THE WORLD'S TOP-200 BEST HEIS

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University has made a phenomenal breakthrough, advancing in the QS global ranking to 165 place. Thus, the leading Kazakhstani University has successfully completed the task set by Elbasy N.A. Nazarbayev, as well as laid down in the State Program on Development of Education and Science of the RK, on entering by 2020 at least of two Kazakhstani Universities in the top-200 best HEIs of the world. KazNU has confirmed its compliance with the high level in the world scientific and educational space.



The most well-known and authoritative internationally recognized rating agency Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) has published new research results on the world's higher education institutions. As emphasized in the analytical report of QS, this year Al-Farabi KazNU, rising up to 42 positions, took 165th place in the global ranking and «became the first Kazakhstani University, which made the breakthrough to the top 200 best HEIs in the world». In the post-Soviet space only two universities has been included in this group – Lomonosov Moscow State University and KazNU.

Demonstrating an unprecedented rapid dynamics in the history of higher education of the world, the University has advanced almost by 500 positions in 9 years. Such progress achieved in a short period of time in the world ranking has attracted the attention of foreign experts, who call this unique breakthrough as an «Al-Farabi KazNU's phenomenon». In the international academic environment it is actively discussed as the most striking example of the dynamic development by the University, many representatives of foreign HEIs have been adopting KazNU's positive experience.

Behind the high position in the world ranking is a huge work of the University staff headed by Rector, academician Galym Mutanov to improve the global competitiveness of KazNU. Based on the cluster approach, a comprehensive structural modernization was carried out, and a results-oriented management system was introduced, which facilitated its transition to a fundamentally new quality of education and science. In cooperation with leading foreign universities, double diploma programs and educational programs are being implemented in

English, thanks to which the largest number of foreign students in Kazakhstan is studying at KazNU. Their number has increased by 15 times last year alone.

Microsoft Company has recognized KazNU's digital development model as one of its best practices. The University has opened scientific and educational centers of world-known high-tech corporations, and created a scientific and technological corridor «from idea generation towards commercialization». Its effective use allowed KazNU to increase the volume of scientific projects more than 2.5 times within five years. Every fifth publication of Kazakhstani authors in international ranking scientific journals belongs to KazNU's scientists. During the same period, the University infrastructure has grown almost by 50 percent.

As the Global Hub of the United Nations Academic Impact Program on Sustainable Development, KazNU has developed and implemented a model of new generation HEI – «University 4.0», which was presented at the United Nations Headquarters in New York and has been recommended for wide international dissemination. KazNU has established Al-Farabi Centers in 12 foreign countries.

The leading positions of Kazakh National University in the world educational and scientific space have been also confirmed by other international rating agencies. Thus, KazNU is among the top 200 most environmentally friendly and top 50 technologically advanced HEIs in the world. Having received high estimation «AA+» by the European Scientific and Industrial Chamber, the Kazakhstani University is in the same row with leading universities of Europe. All these achievements contributed to the recognition of KazNU as the best HEI of the Turkic and Islamic world.

The Massachusetts University of Technology is ranked first in the QS ranking, Stanford and Harvard Universities respectively (all are the US HEIs) took the second and third places. The top ten world universities are almost entirely composed of American and British institutions of higher education.

KAZNU – ICESCO: FIGHTING TOGETHER WITH COVID-19

Al-Farabi KazNU – Global Hub of the UN Academic Impact Program on sustainable development – has received a grant from the Islamic World Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ICESCO) aimed on implementing a project to fight coronavirus.

Since the beginning of the pandemic ICESCO has held an international call for scientific and technological projects aimed at fighting COVID-19 among the universities of the organization's member countries.

KazNU's project has been recognized as one of the best and selected for funding. It is aimed at the production of universal antiseptics and disinfectants of the new generation. The funds allocated by ICESCO will be used to purchase part of the equipment to equip the production, which is planned to be launched in the near future.

Developed by KazNU chemists, antiseptics based on sodium hypochlorite will be produced by electrochemical method and will have a wide range of applications in the medical, municipal and household spheres. The undoubted advantage of disinfectants is their cost, which is much lower than foreign analogues, since Kazakhstan raw materials are used in production. The production will also use patented developments of KazNU scientists, including highly resistant ruthenium oxide titanium anodes, the use of which significantly reduces the cost of production.

The disinfecting product obtained in the frames of the project will be used for the treatment of University buildings, distributed among students and employees, as well as other social strata in need.

ICESCO with its headquarters in Rabat (Morocco), is a structure of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). Its activities are aimed at developing education, science, culture and new technologies and expanding cooperation between the OIC countries in these areas.

The event was ended with a fruitful discussion and exchange of views.

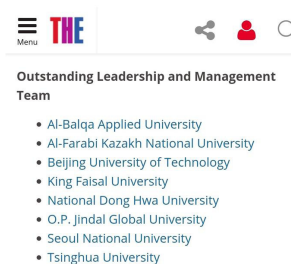
THE: HIGH EVALUATION OF KAZNU MANAGEMENT

JINALYS ROOM

It is no secret that due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the shift of educational institutions to distance learning, many users face problems when using a foreign video communication system. The Kazakhstani web-based videoconferencing application «Jinalys Room», developed by IT specialists from Al-Farabi KazNU, aims to solve this problem.



The new video conferencing service allows for online conferences, meetings, distance learning and includes recording and messaging functions as well as support for various API services for integration with corporate information systems.

One of the main goals of the application is to provide students and lecturers with a user-friendly video conferencing platform with an intuitive interface during their online training. It should be noted that the installation of the web application does not require any additional software and is possible on devices with minimal technical requirements, and data security is ensured by the possibility of installation on the University server infrastructure.

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University was awarded the prestigious international award «Global Islamic Finance Awards 2020» (GIFA) in recognition of its achievements and contribution to the development of education in Islamic finance. The leading Kazakhstani University became the best in the category of «The Best Emerging Islamic Finance Education Provider». The award ceremony was held in

Islamabad (Pakistan). The GIFA is one of the most prestigious awards in the world in the field of Islamic finance, a mark of excellence, which is awarded to governments, institutions and individuals who have achieved outstanding achievements in this field. Among them are heads of the states, famous political leaders, and scientists.

The receiving of the prestigious GIFA-2020 award is the recognition by the international community of the initiatives taken by Al-Farabi Kazakh National University to develop and disseminate Islamic finance.

Kazakhstan was one of the first countries in the post-Soviet space to begin the development of Islamic financing with the establishment of Islamic banks and legislative support of their activities. At the initiative of Yelbasy N. Nazarbayev, the International Financial Center of Astana (IFAC) was established and successfully operates, in the future it is expected that it would become a Hub for Islamic Finance in the region of EAEC and Central Asia.

KazNU in cooperation with leading foreign Universities and the AIFC opened a unique scientific and educational center of Islamic finance, which is equipped with the latest technology and modern software. It became a base for training highly qualified specialists in Islamic banking and finance. It provides training in the skills of exchange trading, the basics of fundamental and technical analysis, and financial engineering. Islamic banking and finance sector is an attractive sector that is increasingly gaining popularity at the international level, which requires appropriate staffing. For the first time in the post-Soviet space, KazNU started the training of Master and PhD students on the educational trajectory «Islamic Finance».





September 22, 2020

THE VISIT OF THE TURKISH AMBASSADOR

Al-Farabi KazNU hosted Mr. Ufuk Ekici, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Turkey to Kazakhstan in the course of which the parties discussed the prospects for mutually beneficial cooperation in science and education.

KAZAKHSTAN ESPORTS STUDENT LEAGUE

We are delighted to bring good news to all students of eSports fans! For the first time in Kazakhstan, there is created a cybersports student league! The «Halyk» Charity Fund, the National Olympic Committee of the Republic of Kazakhstan, and Nursultan Nazarbayev's Education Fund with the support of the Qazaq Cybersport Federation, has launched the National Esports Student Association, a national project on student e-Sports.



The Kazakhstan Esports Student League has been established to promote eSports in the country among the younger generation. This is a significant step in the development of cybersports in Kazakhstan, now the best higher education institutions of the country for the first time will take part in the tournament on cybersports disciplines.

The Student League on Cybersports will be held on a permanent basis and consists of four seasons, in each of which the game disciplines will change. The first season of the Student League will be held from 10 October to 12 November 2020 in the disciplines – PUBG Mobile, CSGO, and Starcraft II. Registration for tournaments opens on 2 October 2020. The prize fund is 1 million tenge!

The first season will bring together teams of seven Universities: Al-Farabi KazNU, UIB, Astana IT University, KBTU, AUES, IITU, and Satbayev University, which will be formed based on the results of internal competitions. From the second season of the tournament, all other Universities will be able to join the National Esports Student Association.

The Kazakhstan Esports Student League will give a systemic boost to the development of the cybersports community in the country and will certainly open up many young talents. The project initiative of the «Halyk» Charity Fund and the National Olympic Committee of Kazakhstan, which unites the largest and most prestigious HEIs of the country, aims to promote Olympic values amongst students and creates conditions for the popularization of modern sports culture.

NEW GLOBAL HUB OFFICE OF THE UN PROGRAM OPENED IN KAZNU

On the 75th anniversary of the founding of the United Nations, a new office of the Global Hub of the United Nations «Academic Impact» Program on Sustainable Development (UNAI) has been opened in Al-Farabi Kazakh National University.

The new office was officially presented to Secretary of State Krymbek Kuserbayev, who during a recent visit to KazNU got acquainted with the activities of the University, which has been heading the UN Global Hub since 2014 for the fourth consecutive term. He highlighted the importance of the work being done and the need to use this platform in promoting Kazakhstani initiatives aimed at solving problems of sustainable development of mankind.

The best practices of Al-Farabi KazNU as the world coordinator of the scientific and educational community on sustainable development issues are in demand and have received high international recognition. For example, the leading Kazakhstani University was the only one of the CIS universities to open its section at the UN World Summit «RIO+20» in Rio de Janeiro, presenting the project «Green Bridge through Generations» in support of the initiatives by Yelbasy N.Nazarbayev «Global Energy and Environmental Development Strategy» and «Green Bridge».

Bright evidence of the active position of the University in implementing the ideas and principles of the UN at the international level became the international conference «New Paradigm of Sustainable Human Development. G-Global – Format for Global Dialogue». At this event in November 2014, for the first time, President Tokayev presented the 10 principles of the new paradigm of sustainable human development to the public. The holistic view of the Head of State on overcoming civilizational faults and building a new world order, taking into account current and future threats, was highly appreciated by experts and the international community. Even today, KazNU, as the head of the UNAI Hub, continues to work purposefully on the implementation of this global initiative, involving broad academic circles. Noteworthy, within the framework of the AEF, KazNU organized and held the 3rd Forum of Asian Universities «Eurasian Diversity and the Role of Universities for Sustainable



Development», which discussed the issues of consolidation of HEIs in addressing new threats and challenges of our time, increasing their role in energy security and sustainable development of society. In 2018, a successfully operating Ban Ki-moon Institute for Sustainable Development was established at KazNU, which was opened with the personal participation of the former UN Secretary-General, Ban Ki-moon.

KazNU conducts active work in the anniversary year of Al-Farabi, promoting his ideas in synergy with the UN Global Citizenship program. The University in collaboration with the UN Alliance of Civilizations is implementing the international project «Formation of Citizens of a Virtuous Society. Mission of Modern Universities», which is based on the ideas of a great thinker on a virtuous society.

On the eve of the UN Day, which is celebrated on 24 October and within the framework of the Decade of Sustainable Development Goals, the international conference «Reason for Peace» will be held to mark the 1150th anniversary of Al-Farabi, the 75th anniversary of the founding of the UN, the 15th anniversary of the UN Alliance of Civilizations and the 10th anniversary of the Academic Impact Program. This high-level event aims to address the creative heritage of Al-Farabi in synergy with UN programs on global citizenship and sustainable development. It is expected to be attended by the heads of UN structures and programs, world-renowned scientists, prominent political leaders and public figures, representatives of the academic community and the media.





October 16, 2020

RESULTS OF AL-FARABI ANNIVERSARY YEAR SUMMED UP IN ALMATY

In Almaty, several events have been held in Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Global Hub of UNAI on Sustainability, with the participation of the State Secretary of Kazakhstan, Chairman of the State Commission for the preparation and holding of the 1150th anniversary of Abu Nasr Al-Farabi Krymbek Kusherbayev. These events were attended by the Minister of Education and Science Askhat Aimagambetov, Minister



of Culture and Sports Aktoty Raimkulova, representatives of the academic community and mass media, teachers and students of the University.

The opening of a bust of the famous scientist and farabiologist Akzhan Zhaksybekuly Mashanov, known in the world as Al-Mashani, took place at Al-Farabi International Center of Al-Farabi KazNU. In his welcoming speech at the ceremony, the Secretary of State highlighted the special contribution of the founder of the Kazakhstani school of farabiology, who scientifically proved to the world that the Second Teacher of Humanity Al-Farabi was born in Kazakhstan in Otrar, the largest center of the ancient culture of Kazakhstan and Central Asia, which used to be called Farabi. Recognition of the invaluable work of the Kazakhstani scientist was also the decision taken half a century ago to hold in Kazakhstan the International Forum within the framework of UNESCO, dedicated to the 1100th anniversary of Al-Farabi, which was held in Almaty in 1975.

At the meeting with scientists, which was held in the format of a round table, Krymbek Kusherbayev summed up some of the results of the 1150th anniversary of Al-Farabi, noting that the anniversary year is being celebrated under the auspices of UNESCO at the international level. Despite the pandemic, the Kazakhstani farabiologists and the scientific community have done great work to popularize and promote the heritage of the great scientist in the country and around the world.

A wide range of international public and academic circles, including representatives



of the UN and UNESCO, OIC, TURKSOY, diplomatic missions, as well as leading foreign farabiologists, have been involved in the anniversary events. With the support of the Embassies of Kazakhstan and Al-Farabi Centers abroad, a number of international conferences have been organized in cooperation with leading foreign universities - Oxford University, Jawaharlal Nehru University, the University of Istanbul, the Kapodistrian National University of Athens, the University of Sofia, the University of Damascus, the University of Egypt

and others. The anniversary of Al-Farabi was celebrated in India, Singapore, Malaysia, and Indonesia. Over 12,000 people from more than 100 universities and other organizations representing 50 countries attended the international events.

More than 60 conferences, round tables, and scientific seminars were held online in the Republic. For example, the nationwide campaign «Integrity Hour», a video lecture «Al-Farabi and Virtuous Society» and a series of online webinars «Second Teacher» were held with open access on social networks. About 14 thousand students of Kazakhstani HEIs, including foreign students from seven countries, took part in the Challenge «Qayirimdi Qogam». Over 9.5 thousand schoolchildren from 10 countries of near and far abroad became participants of the international «Al-Farabi» Subject Olympiad. The winners of the Olympiad have been awarded 40 educational grants to study at Al-Farabi KazNU.

In addition, seven monographs dedicated to Al-Farabi have been published, as well as a collection of Al-Farabi quotes and a collection of thoughts and sayings «Qayirimdilik» in Kazakh, Russian and English. Three previously unpublished treatises of Al-Farabi have been translated from Arabic into Kazakh.

As part of the meeting, a presentation of the «Al-Farabi» encyclopedia, first published in the world, was held. The content of the encyclopedia includes historical facts, information, geographical objects, biographical data, life path, and scientific heritage of the thinker (treatises and comments on them), concepts and terms, works of famous scientists of the Arab-Muslim Renaissance period. It contains bibliographic information on modern researchers, Kazakhstani farabiology, and all those involved in Islamic philosophy, religion, culture, science, and education.

It is planned to open a branch office of KazNU in the Syrian capital Damascus on the basis of Al-Farabi Historical and Cultural Center. By cultivating the ideas of a great

thinker, the University is expanding the spatial, temporal, communicative, and civilizational boundaries of science, education, and culture. For this purpose, 10 Al-Farabi Science and Education Centers have been established in leading universities worldwide as well as two Museum houses of the Second Teacher in Delhi and Istanbul. The Centers carry out wide-ranging work on studying the creative heritage of Al-Farabi, as well as promote the study of Kazakh language, culture, and traditions of the Kazakh people, and acquaint foreign citizens with the history and achievements of Kazakhstan.



Scientists of Science and Technology Park of Al-Farabi KazNU have demonstrated the work of an autonomous intellectual system for non-contact measurement of human body temperature and recognition of the presence or absence of a mask in the areas of high passability and crowded places. The developed system has a number of advantages in comparison with its foreign analogs. It can be integrated into the existing «Onai» electronic ticketing system, which will enable maximum monitoring of mask compliance in public transport, identify intruders and prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus.

Young scientists and IT specialists of Al-Farabi KazNU have developed the Android application «Tracker COV|KZ», which helps to recognize symptoms of the coronavirus and see a doctor in time to diagnose and treat the disease. The mobile application includes a dynamic survey system that provides a detailed report on the presence of coronavirus symptoms. It also makes it possible to send these results to a medical institution or doctor. In addition, the application can track current statistics on the situation with COVID-19 in Kazakhstan. It is now available in two languages – Kazakh and Russian, and it is planned to create versions in English and for OIS. The Android application can be downloaded from Play Market and installed on a mobile device.

Special attention of guests was drawn to samples of antiseptics with extract of chamomile and wormwood to prevent the COVID-19 virus with a wide range of actions. Of particular interest were medicines developed by employees of the Scientific Research Center of Medical Plants of the University using the extraction of new natural compounds from plant raw materials of Kazakhstan.

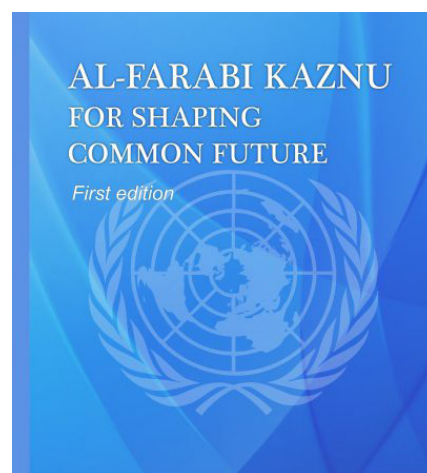

The conference was launched with a video address to the world community made by the Secretary General António Guterres on the occasion of the 75th anniversary of the UN.

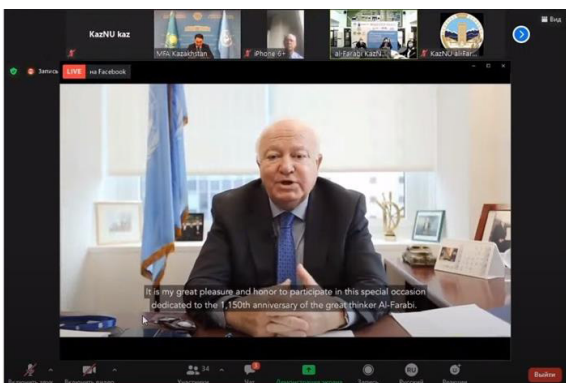

CONQUER SPACE SOON

The joint educational project of KazNU Technopark and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has been successful - participants in the UniSat educational program have conquered outer space by launching the nanosatellite developed by them into the upper atmosphere.

In the framework of the joint educational program, 20 girls aged 14 to 35 from different regions of Kazakhstan have undergone the training for eight months in courses on nanosatellite development based on KazNU Technopark. The girls went through all stages of nanosatellite development and creation, starting with project planning, 3D modelling of the hull and various subsystems, on-board computer programming, satellite assembly and testing, and ending with the launch of the nanosatellite into the upper atmosphere.

This is a kind of unique project initiated by UNICEF to develop science and innovation among girls, and it has shown that girls have coped well with the challenges they faced.

Nanosatellites are an excellent tool for space exploration and development. The advantages of nanosatellites also include their small size, short development time, relatively low financial costs for creation and, most importantly, the involvement of a wide range of students at all stages of spacecraft development. Thanks to these advantages, nanosatellites have become very popular among universities as an educational tool, as evidenced by the exponential growth in the number of launches each year.

URBANIZATION PROBLEMS IN GLOBAL SOUTH COUNTRIES

In honor of World Urban Day, the COMSATS Climate and Sustainable Development Center (CCCS) in collaboration with the Tanzania Industrial Research and Development Organization (TIRDO) held a webinar on «Challenges of rapid development and urbanization in the global South» with participation of professors from the UNESCO Chair in Sustainable Development of the Department of Geography and Nature Management of Al-Farabi KazNU.

Al-Farabi KazNU is the only higher education institution in the CIS that has become a member of the authoritative international intergovernmental organization «COMSATS» (Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development in the South).

The goal of World Cities Day, established by the UN General Assembly, is to draw the attention of the international community to the issues of urbanization and to promote cooperation between countries in addressing urban issues in order to ensure sustainable development. The webinar on the «Challenges of Rapid Development and Urbanization in the Global South» focused on key urbanization issues facing the Global South.

The participants showed great interest in the report by Associate Professor of the UNESCO Chair for Sustainable Development at Al-Farabi KazNU B. Yedilbayev entitled «Problems of Urban and Road Ecology».

Experts from the Global South attended the webinar. Their reports suggested ways to solve the problems of sustainable development, urbanization, projects and solutions in such areas as health care, access to clean drinking water, poor drainage system, air and environmental pollution, solid waste management, and carbon dioxide emissions.

The United Nations General Assembly has designated the 28th of October as World Cities Day (under the overarching theme of Better City, Better Life, this year the focus will be on "Reimagining Our Communities and Cities").

Aim of the day is to focus international community's attention on urbanization as a central issue for development and to promote cooperation among countries in addressing urban challenges towards building sustainable development.

To commemorate the United Nations World Cities Day on 28 October 2020 COMSATS Centre for Climate and Sustainability (CCCS) is jointly hosting a webinar in cooperation with its partner institution the Tanzania Industrial Research and Development Organization (TIRDO).

The webinar will focus on key issues of urbanization facing countries in the Global South. The webinar will bring together experts from the Global South to identify challenges of building sustainable urbanization and propose solutions in areas of health, access to clean drinking water, poor drainage system, air pollution, solid waste management, carbon emissions and environmental degradation.

IT COMPETITION HUAWEI ICT-2020

For the first time in Kazakhstan, the «Huawei» Academy of Infocommunication Technologies, which operates under the auspices of Al-Farabi KazNU, jointly with «Huawei» ICT Solutions Kazakhstan, is holding a competition aimed at supporting young talents and future leaders of the IT industry.

The competition is held jointly with the leading global company «Huawei», which is the general sponsor of the project. The competition is held in 3 stages:

Stage 2 – a video presentation of the project will be held from 16 to 22 November. A special committee selects the most relevant and innovative ideas from the registered list. Participants who have passed the 2nd stage will be notified by email or phone number specified in the application. Participants must record a video presentation of their project with a detailed description of the idea and the expected result.

Stage 3 – summing up will take place from 23 to 26 November.

Based on the video material, the Competition Committee will select 10 finalists. They will need to prepare and present a detailed presentation at the final ZOOM meeting on 26 November, and they will need to convince the jury members why their idea should be implemented. All 10 finalists will receive memorable prizes from Huawei, and the winners will receive a grant for their own projects (1st place – 1 million tenge, 2nd and 3rd places – 500 thousand tenge).

MINI- GLOBAL ASSOCIATION MDP SUMMIT

Al-Farabi KazNU as the Global Hub of UNAI on Sustainability has attended the Global Association MDP Summit. Usually, a global association mdp summit is held over five days, face-toface, on the campus of one of the mdp programs. on november 20, an abbreviated form of the Summit was held online in a little over



three and a half hours In its 12 years, this is the first time the Summit was not held in its traditional form. Covid-19 has challenged all of us to innovate, and one benefit of this innovation is that more than 160 people, from all six MDP regions, were able to participate in our meeting, and most stayed for all of it. This is a notable increase from the 30 or so that usually attend the MDP Summit. The prohibitively high cost involved with travelling, lodging, and meals have limited the number of people who could participate face-toface in previous years. This is true not only of faculty members, but also of students, who participated in the large numbers this year.

Jeffrey D. Sachs, one of the intellectual authors of the MDP program, opened with a talk called “How might the MDP program build on successes, innovation and creativity during COVID-19 to strengthen the Global Association moving forward?” Following Dr. Sach’s Q and A session, the SDSN’s SDG Academy, an online education platform, presented on free educational resources for teaching and learning about sustainable development, that can be used to support specific pillars of the MDP program.

KAZAKHSTANI “AL-FARABI CENTER” IS TO BE LAUNCHED IN THE USA

The scientific and educational center is to be established in Maryland (USA) by the mutual agreement between Al-Farabi Kazakh National University and Civilizations Exchange & Cooperation Foundation (CECF).

This will be an important event in the development of cooperation between the United States and Kazakhstan in the year of celebrating the 1150th anniversary of Al-Farabi, the Great Philosopher of civilizations.

The main mission of Civilizations Exchange & Cooperation Foundation is the development of cooperation between peoples of different confessions and cultures.

Lately, KazNU jointly with the George Washington University in America, and with the support of the Embassy of Kazakhstan in the United States, held an online round table dedicated to the anniversary of the great thinker. The University has established and actively operates 12 Al-Farabi centers and houses in different countries around the world. This is the first time this kind of center will be launched in America.

The agreement to open the first Al-Farabi Center in the United States is regarded as a sign of high respect to the personality of the thinker of humanity and special interest in his humanistic heritage. SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

The prospects for cooperation in the field of science, education, and innovation development were discussed during the meeting by the rector of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University Galimkair Mutanov and Ambassador of Austria to Kazakhstan Willy Kempel. The United Nations General Assembly has proclaimed the period 2013-2022 as the International Decade for the Rapprochement of Cultures. In this context, the goal of founding the Eurasian network of universities, which is aimed at creating a culture of knowledge among student youth as a beneficial environment for sustainable development of humanity, becomes particularly relevant. A new generation of highly qualified specialists - individuals with high ethical and civic attitudes will be able to make a worthy contribution to the development of civilization.

The Eurasian network of universities has been founded under the patronage of the International Centre for the Rapprochement of Cultures under the auspices of UNESCO, which is headed by Olzhas Suleimenov. The Centre is located in Almaty and is a unique international institute specially established to give a new impetus to dialogue and education of planetary consciousness through the development of science, education, strengthening of universal values and cultural diversity.

This year, the 1150th anniversary of Al-Farabi and the 175th anniversary of Abai are being celebrated internationally with the support of UNESCO. The international community has appreciated the outstanding contribution of thinkers to the development of civilization. In this regard, the initiators of the online meeting suggest naming the Eurasian University Network after the educators and humanists – Al-Farabi and Abai.

The official opening ceremony of the «Eurasian Network of Universities to Support the Culture of Knowledge without Borders» resulted in the adoption of the final communiqué and charter of the association.

WINNERS OF THE COMPETITION AMONG YOUNG SCIENTISTS TO SOLVE THE CONSEQUENCES OF COVID-19

The Council of Young Scientists of the Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, jointly with the Nursultan Nazarbayev Foundation, organized and conducted an online Republican competition of scientific projects for young scientists on the topic «My vision of resolving the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic».



On November 6, 2020, the Council of Young Scientists of Al-Farabi Kazakh National University announced a republican competition of scientific projects among researchers up to 40 years old within the framework of the grant of the Nursultan Nazarbayev Foundation won in 2019 as the «Best Council of Young Scientists». The main goal of the Competition is to provide a platform for young scientists to discuss solutions to the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic for various spheres of life in Kazakhstan. THE MAIN ISSUE IS THE STATE OF THE PLANET

At the World Leadership Forum, organized by Columbia University (USA), a speech by the Secretary-General of the UN Antonio Guterres on «The State of the Planet» took place. Al-Farabi Kazakh national University, which leads a Global hub of the UN «Academic impact» program on sustainability, was invited as a partner to participate at the online high-level meeting.

During the speech at Columbia University, the Secretary-General of the UN Antonio Guterres called on world leaders to make 2021 the year when humanity ends its “war with nature” and commits to building a future free from planet-heating carbon. Commenting on new reports on record-breaking weather conditions in 2020 and the growing volume of fossil fuel production that is causing global warming, Antonio Guterres urged curbing climate change. Referring to the fact that countries around the world are spending trillions of dollars to recover from the downturn caused by the pandemic, he stressed the need to do so with a focus on clean energy. The UN Secretary-General paid special attention to the role of educational institutions in solving urgent problems of the state of the Earth.

The international high-level forum is hold annually by the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) of the United Nations, established in 2012 at the initiative of the United Nations SG and led by Columbia University Professor Jeffrey Sachs. The main mission of the SDSN is to promote integrated approaches to achieving the sustainable development goals (SDGs) and the Paris Agreement on climate change through education, research, policy analysis, and global cooperation.

KazNU has a long-standing partnership in this area, having joined the Global Association of MDP and SDSN in 2012, along with such leading world universities as Harvard, University of California Berkeley, Columbia, Tsinghua and others, initiating the only in the CIS graduate program on “Sustainable development” MDP Global Classroom based on world-class University training programs.

YOUTH FOR SDG 6

Ban Ki-moon Institute for Sustainable Development at al-Farabi KazNU in cooperation with the Central Asian Youth Association for Water Resources “CAY4W” (Central Asian Youth for Water), the online platform WaterCafe, the club of political scientists PhD Welt and the Representative Office of the Foundation. Friedrich Ebert in Kazakhstan organized a meeting-discussion on the theme «Youth and SDG 6 as accelerators of the Sustainable Development Goals: Initiatives in Kazakhstan».

I INTERNATIONAL SCIENTIFIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL FORUM

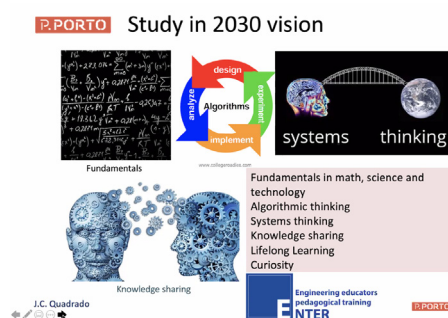

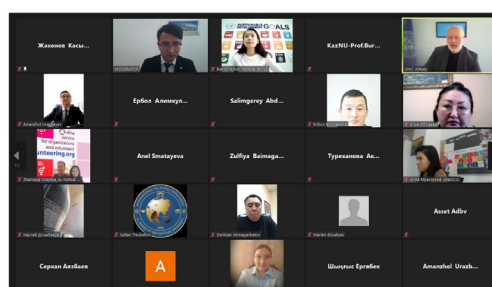

Al-Farabi Kazakh National University, Global Hub of UNA1 on Sustainability, held an online round table on the topic «Better recovery: Stand up for Human Rights» dedicated to the 75th anniversary of the UN, the 10th anniversary of the UNA1 Hub KazNU on sustainability and the 25th anniversary of the Faculty of International Relations at al-Farabi KazNU. This year's Human Rights Day theme is linked to the COVID-19 pandemic and focuses on the need for more effective recovery by ensuring that human rights play a central role in the field. The agenda of the round table was topical, which found its expression in the interested and enthusiastic speeches of the participants, they also manifested themselves in the discussion of the problems of the UN activities on the implementation of the principles of the UN Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The round table was held online in Kazakh, Russian and English. The discussion was attended by the heads and representatives of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan, UN, UNESCO, UNDP, UNA1 in Almaty, young scientists, undergraduates, Master's and PhD students of universities in Kazakhstan.

In his report, Chairman of the Presidium of the Anti-Terrorism Committee, Amanzhol Urazbayev spoke about the work of the Committee, which has enormous potential in the person of unique experts, general practitioners and theoretical scientists with vast professional experience. VATICAN YOUTH SYMPOSIUM GOES VIRTUAL IN 2020

Ban Ki-moon Institute for sustainable development at KazNu took a part in traditionally held at the Casina Pio IV in Vatican City, the 2020 VYS which took on a virtual format due to the constraints of the global pandemic. Day 2 hosted discussions on Human Rights, Dignity & Fratelli Tutti, Sustainable Cities & Communities, and Innovation, Entrepreneurship & Technology presenting inspiring messages of how the synergy between the creativity of younger generations and the expertise of older ones curate progressive change. The 2020 Symposium was opened by Professor Jeffrey D. Sachs, the Director of the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN), Monsignor Marcelo Sánchez Sorondo, Chancellor of the Pontifical Academy of Sciences and Ban Ki-moon, Chair, Ban Ki-Moon Centre for Global Citizens (BKMC). The solutions discussed and generated at the Vatican Youth Symposium were wide-ranging and multifaceted. It had a special focus on the following themes:

- Technology, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship for Sustainable Development
- Education for Sustainable Development, Global Citizenship, and 21st Century Skills
- Sustainable Cities and Communities
- Human Rights, Human Dignity & Fratelli Tutti
- Role of Universities and Academia in Sustainable Development
- Sustainable Cities & Communities
