Introduction

Training and engagement of staff and students: The university should educate and engage its staff and students in sustainable practices and goals to create a broad cultural imperative for sustainability within the university community.

Supporting the community in achieving SDGs: The university should collaborate with local and international communities to promote the achievement of the SDGs. This can include partnerships with organizations, participation in development projects, and sharing knowledge and experience.

Accountability and monitoring of SDG achievement measures: The university may establish monitoring and reporting mechanisms to assess its progress in achieving the SDGs. This includes defining key performance indicators related to the SDGs and regularly reporting results to the community and stakeholders about its sustainability activities and achievements.

Encouragement and recognition of activities aimed at achieving the SDGs: The university can develop systems for rewarding and recognizing those who actively participate in achieving the SDGs. This may include scholarships, awards, and other forms of recognition.

Overall, the university's policy on achieving sustainable development goals should be a targeted, multifaceted, and long-term effort that encompasses educational, research, and practical measures aimed at supporting sustainable development at all levels. The university's research and innovation policy should

focus on creating an environment that encourages and supports research activities students working the SDGs, providing resources and support for researchers and the potential to make a significant contribution to achieving the SDGs through its research and innovative activities, and a sustainability-oriented policy plays a key role in this process.
